	being pumped.
1997	Albuquerque decides on a plan to start using our
	San Juan - Chama water as a drinking water source.
2004	Office of State Engineer approves the permit to
	divert San Juan - Chama water out of the Rio
	Grande. Construction begins.
2007	Diversion dam and 12 of 15 pipelines are
	completed.
2008	December 5, 2008, the Surface Water Treatment
	Plant opens and begins production of drinking
	water for homes and businesses in Albuquerque.
